## **The Circle of Courage and PPC in Northern Ireland**

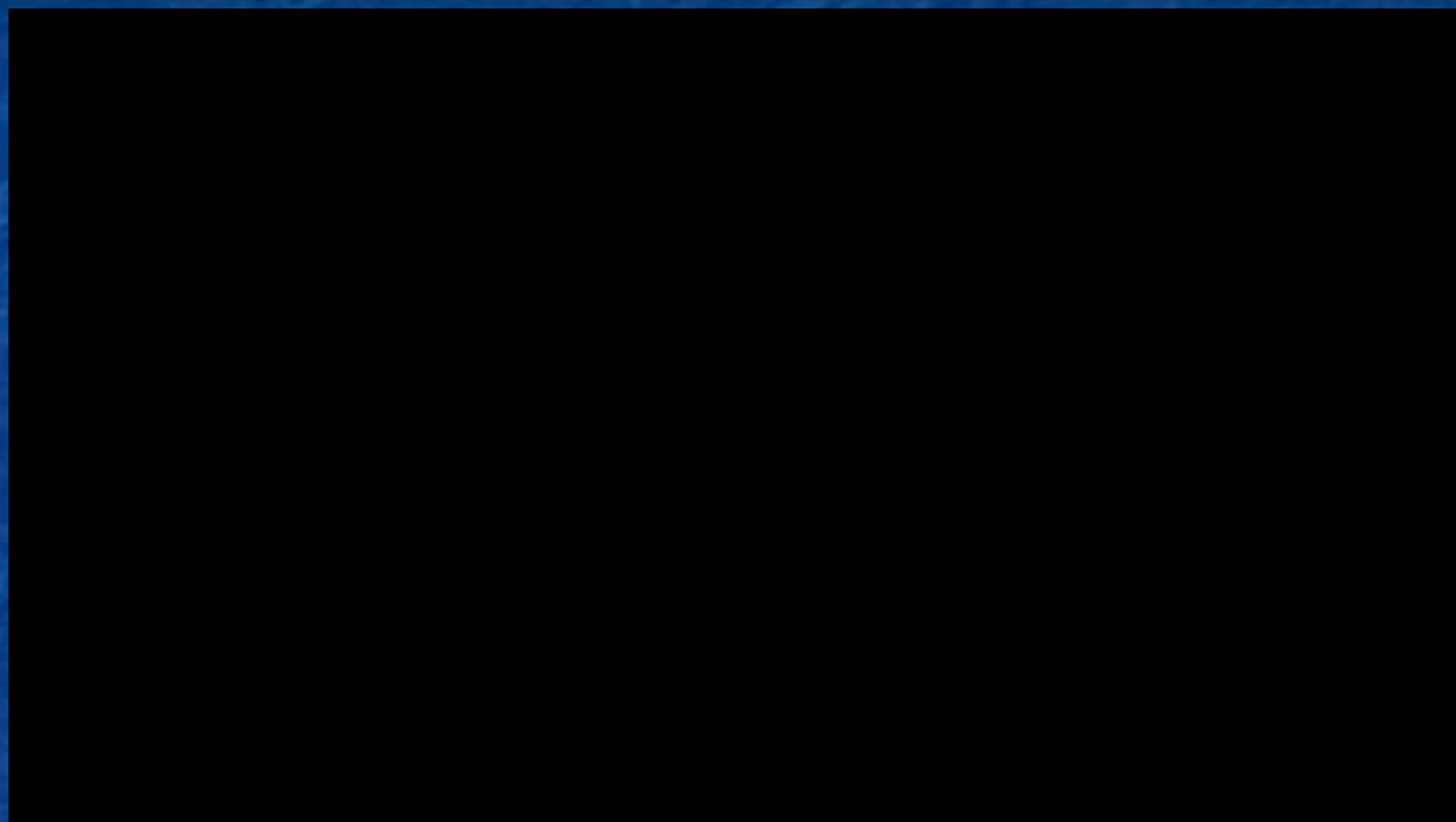

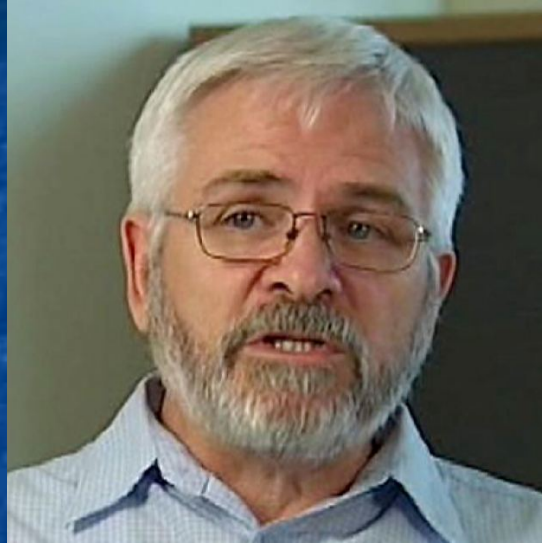

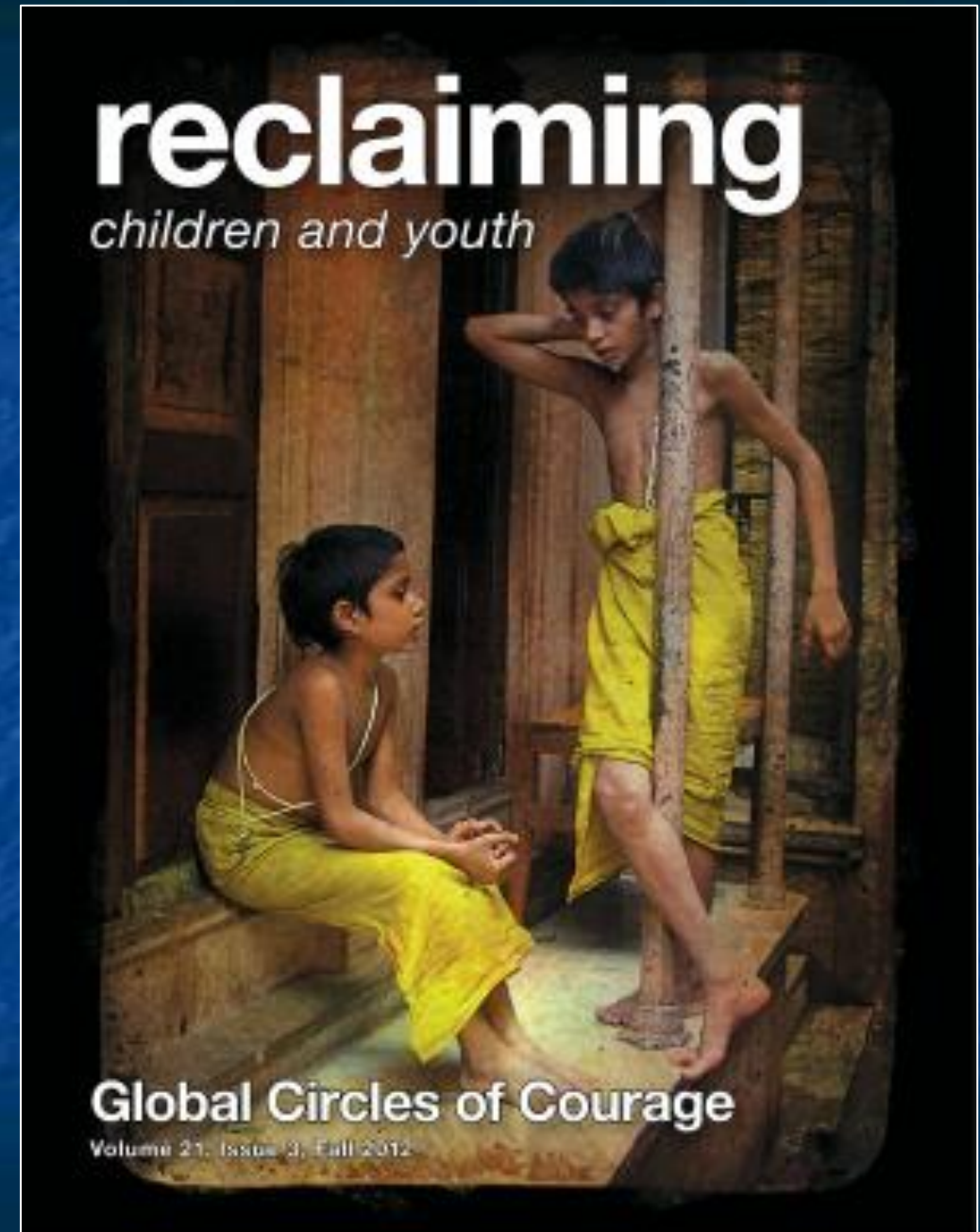
